Most merciful God, who by the death and resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ delivered and saved the world: grant that by faith in him who suffered on the cross we may triumph in the power of his victory; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

FIRST READING Jeremiah 31.31-34

A reading from the book of the prophet Jeremiah.

The days are surely coming, says the LORD, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt—a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the LORD. But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the LORD: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, 'Know the LORD', for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the LORD; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.

This is the word of the Lord. **All Thanks be to God.**

SECOND READING Hebrews 5.5-10

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews.

Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him, 'You are my Son, today I have begotten you'; as he says also in another place, 'You are a priest for ever, according to the order of Melchizedek.' In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him, having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek.

GOSPEL READING John 12.20-33

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

All Glory to you, O Lord.

Among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, 'Sir, we wish to see Jesus.' Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. Jesus answered them, 'The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will

'Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say—"Father, save me from this hour"? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name.' Then a voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.' The crowd standing there heard it and said that it was thunder. Others said, 'An angel has spoken to him.' Jesus answered, 'This voice has come for your sake, not for mine. Now is the judgement of this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. And I, when I am lifted

up from the earth, will draw all people to myself.' He said this to indicate the kind of death he was to die.

many. To be part of the Electoral Roll is another way you demonstrate your sense of

belonging which allows you to participate actively in the affairs of our common life and

ministry.

If you wish to cast a vote at the forthcoming Annual Church Meeting, to be held on Sunday

28th April 2024, you must be on the electoral roll. If you are already on the electoral roll and

we have your email address, you will receive a message from the Cathedral office by

Monday 18th March 2024 confirming that you do not need to re-register. If you are unsure

about your status on the electoral roll, please phone the Cathedral office at 2523 4157.

All other qualified electors who wish their names to appear in the Electoral Roll must

complete an "Electoral Roll Declaration". You may download it from the Cathedral website

or collect from the Cathedral office. You are a qualified elector if you are (a) 18 years old

and above; (b) are baptized and a member of the Anglican Church or a Church in communion

therewith; (c) do not belong to any religious body which is not in communion with the

Anglican Church; and (d) are not entered upon the Electoral Roll of any other Church in the

Diocese.

Completed forms must reach the Cathedral office, by Sunday 7th April 2024 for inclusion in

the Electoral Roll for the purpose of the Annual Church Meeting 2024. Any inquiries may

be directed to Mr Thomas Li, the Executive Administrator of the Cathedral.
