Discovery Bay Church

Discovery Bay Church serves the people living in and around the resort. The congregation is a mix of shortand long-term internationals and local people. The church worships in the local Anglican School, Wei Lun Primary School hall. Also present in Wei Lun School is our sister Chinese congregation, Church of Incarnation. Founded in October 1983, it is the oldest church in the resort. It began as a non-denominational church served by a rota of priests and ministers from various denominations. In 1989 it became a daughter church of St John's.

Today the church has an average attendance of about 60 people. The average age of a congregant is probably mid 40's. There is a vibrant children's ministry. Some extremely talented musicians and singers enhance the Sunday worship and enrich the life of the church.



Emmanuel Church, Pokulam

Emmanuel Church is an English speaking Anglican community serving the western district of Hong Kong Island. We pride ourselves on being a friendly, inclusive community firmly rooted in the Anglican tradition. We welcome visitors as well as permanently residents from all over the world.

In December 2006 the community moved to the beautifully restored neo-Gothic George C. Tso Memorial Chapel at Béthanie, a heritage building built by the French Mission in 1875.

Every Sunday we celebrate a Sung Eucharist and many who come have young families. We encourage all Emmanuel kids to join our Sunday school.




St Stephen's Chapel, Stanley

St Stephen's is one of the three daughter churches of St John's Cathedral. We meet in the lovely school chapel of St Stephen's College, Stanley.

Built in 1949, the chapel is exactly 100 years younger than the Cathedral. Inside it's beautifully light, with large clear glass windows with views over the sea, hills and islands revealing the beauty of God's creation. The chapel is a wonderful acoustic space for concerts, and on Sundays our worship is enriched by our lovely pipe organ. People come to St Stephen's from all over the Southside and from the city, drawn by our middle Anglican style of worship, and a community where it's easy to make friends.

God's Business

The Church is in business. We're in God's business, the business of holiness. Our work, the business of the Church, is to bring God close to people and people close to God.

- How do we do that? What does God's business • look like? What does God deal in?
- Here are three of Jesus' parables that illustrate the ٠ qualities that are the business of God.

Compassion

In the parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10), the Samaritan sees the man beaten and left for dead by robbers, and he has compassion. While others ignore the man's suffering and pass by on the other side, the Samaritan takes the wounded man to an inn and pays the innkeeper to take care of him. loving the stranger – at a cost to himself.

Forgiveness

The Prodigal Son (Luke 15) wastes his father's money and is reduced to misery and starvation, until he decides to return home. When his father sees him. instead of anger at his son's wastefulness, he forgives and welcomes him back. It's not the way of the world, but it's God's way. God doesn't hold sin against us, his nature is to forgive.

Generositv

Many people don't like the parable of the Labourers in (2 Corinthians 9.7) the Vinevard (Matthew 20). Those who work only for an hour are given the same wage as those who work Glad generosity was a hallmark of the first church in all day. It's not fair, and it doesn't make good business Jerusalem: sense – but it's how God runs his business. SJC Counselling Service

St John's Cathedral Counselling Service as an outreach ministry provides affordable counselling services to individuals, couples, and families in need. Our calling is to offer safe and confidential support and guidance for our community in Hong Kong.

We offer a wide range of services including individual, couple and family counselling, pre-marital counselling, psychoeducational and Special Educational Needs assessment, onsite school counselling, Employee Assistance Programs, crisis intervention and family mediation.

With a team of committed and highly competent counsellors and psychologists who speak over 14 languages and dialects, we are experienced in working with a range of issues including emotional and mental health problems, relationship/marital and family therapy, trauma, addiction, and work stress, etc. For more information, please visit: http://www.sjccs.hk.

SJC Life Enrichment Centre

LEC was established in 2018, dedicated to promoting the physical, psychological, social and spiritual wellbeing of young people. As stipulated in our slogan, 'Aspire to Inspire, Together we Thrive!', we strive to 'Lift up the spirit of youths; Empower and uncover their hidden potential; Console and be their refuge.'

Our services fall into three categories, including:


- 1. Individual/ coaching services
- 2. Developmental/ supportive services, and

3. Community education services

Another area of our work is the Cathedral youth ministry called 'Among Us'. The group meets every Friday evening. We encourage participants to explore more about faith and to lead a committed life by becoming more involved in different church activities.

The number of our beneficiaries increases every year. In 2022, we served more than 4,000 attendees through various life education programmes. We count on your support to serve the needs of the young people.







Mission For Migrant Workers

The Mission For Migrant Workers (MFMW) believes that migrant domestic workers (MDWs) are integral in our society and they deserve care, respect and protection. We provide comprehensive services to migrants in distress, empower their communities, promote harmony in households and work for a more multicultural and inclusive society.

We provide welfare assistance, guidance and support to more than 10,000 migrants in distress every year.

Our innovative Give Care to Caregivers service fair mobilises local and expatriate volunteers to cater to health, leisure and social needs of MDWs.

We continuously work to improve social relations of employers and domestic workers believing that Christians hiring migrants have the foundations rooted on Christian faith and values, thereby building harmonious households; as we ensure that both parties are adequately informed about labour laws and are culturally sensitised promoting understanding, mutual trust and respect.

SJC Bookstore

Our Bookstore serves as the welcoming and visitors' centre for many who come to the Cathedral:


- for some, we are the first stop in their hunt to find one of the other Cathedral's ministries;
- for others, the first stop in tracking down their family histories;
- and yet for a few people who need someone to talk to - we offer a listening ear.

Prior to the COVID-19, we had nearly 100,000 visitors

every year. We open 363 days all year round except for the two days stock-taking.

We are not just a shop full of religious books. Over 1,000 titles can be found on our shelves, while numerous liturgical items, together with over 8,000 greeting cards and some 35,000 gift items, are also available for our church community. Besides, we sponsor a Charity Christmas Card and Handicrafts Fair in November each year, and hold book fairs in schools and churches to show our supports to the wider-community commitment to **Welcome, Nurture**, and **Inform**.





Filipino Ministry

St John's is a welcoming church. People of various nationalities come to the Cathedral to worship, to pray, to spend time with God, or even just to rest their weary bodies and minds from the hustle and bustle of the city.

Filipinos are among those who come. Most of them are foreign domestic workers. They visited their parish churches before leaving for overseas work. Many of them sought a church on their first day-off: to thank God for their safe arrival, to pray for their families, and for themselves, as a new chapter in their lives open. Their search led many of them to St John's.

In 1982 the Filipino Fellowship of St John's Cathedral, composed of Filipino Anglicans, was formed. By 1983,

the Cathedral adopted the Mission for Migrant Workers (MFMW) as its outreach ministry, to assist migrant workers in distress.

In 1994, a Filipino priest, the Revd Dwight Q. dela Torre was appointed Chaplain of MFMW, and the first Pilipino Eucharist was celebrated. The Iglesia Filipina Independiente HK Fellowship (IFI-HK Fellowship) was formed later that year. Twenty years on, the Saturday Pilipino Eucharist was introduced. In 2019, the second Filipino priest, the Revd Sharon Langbis was appointed.

Both the Filipino Fellowship and the IFI-HK Fellowship are not only involved in the life and ministry of St John's but also in the wider migrants' community in Hong Kong. The Filipinos who regularly worship at the Cathedral, consider St John's as their spiritual home.

HONORARY TREASURER'S MESSAGE

St John's Cathedral opened for divine service on Sunday 11th March 1849, and will be celebrating its 175th anniversary in 2024. Together with its daughter churches and outreach ministries, the Cathedral has been a place for worship, community service, education and fellowship for the Hong Kong community, and it continues to stand out as an anchor for both the community and our personal lives.

In the seven years since our last Stewardship Campaign, we have seen protests, pandemic, inflation and many other difficult events, but we remain strong in our faith and we have been striving to continue to serve our parishioners and the wider community.

Besides having over 20 services every week in English, Mandarin, Cantonese and Tagalog, the Cathedral is operating four Outreach Ministries serving the community in all walks of life: St John's Cathedral Counselling Service, the Life Enrichment Centre,
