A reading from Acts of the Apostles.

In those days Peter stood up among the believers (together the crowd numbered about one hundred and twenty people) and said, 'Friends, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit through David foretold concerning Judas, who became a guide for those who arrested Jesus— for he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry.' So one of the men who have accompanied us throughout the time that the LORD Jesus went in and out among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us—one of these must become a witness with us to his resurrection.' So they proposed two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and Matthias. Then they prayed and said, 'LORD, you know everyone's heart. Show us which one of these two you have chosen to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned

aside to go to his own place.' And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias; and he was added to the eleven apostles.

All mine are yours, and yours are mine; and I have been glorified in them. And now I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one, as we are one. While I was with them, I protected them in your name that you have given me. I guarded them, and not one of them was lost except the one destined to be lost, so that the scripture might be fulfilled. But now I am coming to you, and I speak these things in the world so that they may have my joy made complete in themselves. I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. I am not asking you to take them out of the world, but I ask you to protect them from the evil one. They do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. As you have sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. And for their sakes I sanctify myself, so that they also may be sanctified in truth.'

Sermon

Following the sermon, all STAND.

All We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

> We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate: he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

> We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

The celebrant introduces the prayers by saying

Holy God, as we gather in fellowship and worship to hear your word, to sing your praise, and to break bread in the presence of the Risen Christ, hear our prayers and walk with us along the road of life.

All KNEEL or SIT. The intercessor continues:

Lord of the Church, we pray for our bishops and priests who preach the Gospel, bringing a light to those in darkness, and words of love to those in need of comfort. We pray for all preparing for baptism and confirmation, that they may be faithful to Christ in following him along the road of faith.

Lord in your mercy

All hear our prayer.

Lord of Creation, your son walked the roads of the Holy Land and taught us to seek your hand in the beauty and wonders of earth and sea and sky. We so often see too much of the evidence of poor stewardship in our surroundings, and it is easy to forget that the world belongs to you. Help us to recognize your presence in our modern world, and help us to use more wisely the resources of the earth.

Lord in your mercy

All hear our prayer.

Lord of Life, we thank you for the gift of your Son, our Saviour, who walks with us on the journey of our lives. We pray for all who travel with us in our family, among our friends, and within this community. We pray for a deepening awareness of our need for one another, and of your image in the hearts of everyone we meet. Lord in your mercy

All hear our prayer.

Lord of Healing, you send your son to walk with those we know who are going through a time of suffering and pain. We pray for all those within our Cathedral parish who have asked for our prayers; help us to be always aware of one another's needs, and to respond accordingly, and assist them with words and deeds onto the road of recovery.

Lord in your mercy

All hear our prayer.

Lord of Eternity, accompany those travelling, through the valley of death, and may our love and prayers support those who walk that journey today. We also call to mind those who have died recently and all whose anniversaries of death fall around this time. [We remember especially...] May they \mathfrak{P} rest in peace and rise in glory. Lord in your mercy

All hear our prayer.

In a moment of silence let us offer our hopes and prayers to the Father's love.

The celebrant concludes the prayers with the following Collect:

Faithful God, as we go out into your world from our worship today, we thank you for walking alongside us wherever we travel, and, if like those first disciples, we fail to be aware of you, forgive us for our human weakness and open our eyes to see you as a constant companion and friend.

Merciful Father All accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our Saviour, Jesus Christ. Amen.

All STAND and the celebrant introduces the Peace:

God has made us one in Christ. He has set his seal upon us and, as a pledge of what is to come, has given the Spirit to dwell in our hearts. Alleluia.

The Offertory Taking of the Bread and Wine

All REMAIN STANDING as the collection is taken. The gifts of the people are gathered and presented. The altar is prepared and bread and wine are placed upon it.

Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many

for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me. Great is the mystery of faith: Christ has died: Christ is risen: Christ will come again.

Send the Holy Spirit on your people and gather into one in your kingdom all who share this one bread and one cup, so that we, in the company of the Blessed Virgin Mary, St John the Evangelist, St Stephen, and all the saints may praise and glorify you for ever, through Jesus Christ our Lord;

by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.


Breaking of the Bread

The celebrant says the invitation to communion.

The celebrant and people receive communion If you are baptized in any Christian tradition you are very welcome to receive Holy Communion at our altar.

Words of the distribution are said and the communicant replies

Amen.

Those who are not baptized are welcome to come to the altar for a blessing. Please keep your arms crossed upon your breast as an indication.

During the distribution, the Children's Choir sings
