Give us courage to spread hope in the world. Amen.

#### **COLLECT**

Almighty God, give us grace to cast away the works of darkness and to put on the armour of light, now in the time of this mortal life, in which your Son Jesus Christ came to us in great humility; that on the last day, when he shall come again in his glorious majesty to judge the living and the dead, we may rise to the life immortal; through him who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.** 

# FIRST READING Isaiah 2.1-5

A reading from the prophet Isaiah.

The word that Isaiah son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem.

In days to come the mountain of the LORD's house shall be established as the highest of the mountains, and shall be raised above the hills; all the nations shall stream to it. Many peoples shall come and say, 'Come, let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, to the house of the God of Jacob; that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths.' For out of Zion shall go forth instruction, and the word of the LORD from Jerusalem. He shall judge between the nations, and shall arbitrate for many peoples; they shall beat their swords into ploughshares, and their spears into pruning-hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither

shall they learn war any more.

O house of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the LORD!

This is the word of the Lord. **All Thanks be to God.** 

#### **PSALM 122**

1 I was glad when they said unto me: We will go into the house of the Lord.

2 Our feet shall stand in thy gates:

O Jerusalem.

3 Jerusalem is built as a city: that is at

unity in itself.

4 For thither the tribes go up, even the tribes of the Lord: to testify unto Israel, to give thanks unto the Name of the Lord.

5 For there is the seat of judgement : even the seat of the house of David.

6 O pray for the peace of Jerusalem: they shall prosper that love thee.

7 Peace be within thy walls : and plen-

teousness within thy palaces.

8 For my brethren and companions' sakes: I will wish thee prosperity.

9 Yea, because of the house of the Lord our God: I will seek to do thee good. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son: and to the Holy Ghost;

As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be: world without end. Amen.

## SECOND READING Romans 13.11-end

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans.

Brothers and sisters, you know what time it is, how it is now the moment for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we became believers; the night is far gone, the day is near. Let us then lay aside the works of darkness and put on the armour of light; let us live honourably as in the day, not in revelling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarrelling and jealousy. Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

This is the word of the Lord. **All Thanks be to God.** 

### GOSPEL READING Matthew 24.36-44

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew. **All Glory to you, O Lord.** 

Jesus spoke to his disciples: 'About that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. For as the days of Noah were, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day Noah entered the ark, and they knew nothing until the flood came and swept them all away, so too will be the coming of the Son of Man. Then two will be in the field; one will be taken and one will be left. Two women will be grinding meal together; one will be taken and one will be left. Keep awake therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. But understand this: if the owner of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **All Praise to you, O Christ.**

### TICKETS FOR CHRISTMAS EVE **MIDNIGHT MASS** 24th December (Tue) at 11.00pm

Each Christmas Eve we welcome over 1300 people to our Midnight Mass of the Nativity and the numbers are growing. We will be issuing tickets again this year to ensure that there is a fair distribution to members of the Cathedral congregations and the wider community.

- 1) Reservation of tickets can be made by calling the Cathedral Office at 2523 4157, commencing 2<sup>nd</sup> December (Mon) during office hours. (Advance booking not accepted.)
  - the first 200 tickets are reserved for those who have a Stewardship number or members on Electoral
  - the second batch of 140 tickets are available on a first-come-firstserved basis
  - Max. 2 tickets per person or 4 tickets per family.
- 2) Those who have reserved and confirmed their tickets by phone should collect their tickets within 8 days **after confirmation**. These can be picked up during office hours on weekdays; or from 9.00am to 1.30pm on Sundays.

The remaining 100 tickets will be distributed at the main door at 9.00pm on the 24<sup>th</sup> December.

- 3) On the night (24<sup>th</sup> December), ticket holders will be admitted from 10.00pm, using the two Transept doors of the Church.
- 4) All ticket holders are requested to be seated by 10.30pm when the Devotion before Midnight Mass begins.
- 5) Any unoccupied seats will be released to non-ticket holders under the supervision of the sidesmen at 10.45pm.
- 6) Overflow provision will be prepared for worshippers in both the Li Hall and the North lawn.
