COLLECT

FIRST READING Acts 10.44-48

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

While Peter was speaking, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who heard the word. The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on the Gentiles, for they heard them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter said, 'Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?' So he ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they invited him to stay for several days.

9 Let the floods clap their hands, and let the hills be joyful together before the Lord: for he is come to judge the earth.

10 With righteousness shall he judge the world: and the people with equity. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son: and to the Holy Ghost;

As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be: world without end. Amen.

SECOND READING 1 John 5.1-6

A reading from the first letter of John.

Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ has been born of God, and everyone who loves the parent loves the child. By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God and obey his commandments. For the love of God is this, that we obey his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome, for whatever is born of God conquers the world. And this is the victory that conquers the world, our faith. Who is it that conquers the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God? This is the one who came by water and blood, Jesus Christ, not with the water only but with the water and the blood. And the Spirit is the one that testifies, for the Spirit is the truth.

This is the word of the Lord. All Thanks be to God.

GOSPEL READING John 15.9-17

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John. All Glory to you, O Lord.

Jesus said to his disciples:

As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy

may be complete.

'This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. All Praise to you, O Christ.

Dr Eric Chong was ordained Priest of the Sheng Kung Hui (Anglican). He is currently Master of St john's College, and Assisting Priest in Christ Church, Kowloon Tong. He also teaches Old Testament Studies at HKSKH Ming Hua Theological College, and is Adjunct Lecturer of Charles Sturt University for theological degree programmes in Minghua. Dr Chong received his education and training in Engineering, Theology and History of Religions, Anthropology and Archaeology, and Philosophy and Comparative Literature. He has been conducting research and writing, on Medical Anthropology in in S.E. Asia and China, seeking to enhance methods of Western Psychiatry with traditional Folk medical practices, to help patients with Dissociative Identity Disorder. His concurrent research and advocacy is in the field of sexuality, gender identity and rights.
