Just as you were once disobedient to God but have now received mercy because of their disobedience, so they have now been disobedient in order that, by the mercy shown to you, they too may now receive mercy. For God has imprisoned all in disobedience so that he may be merciful to all.

But he did not answer her at all. And his disciples came and urged him, saying, 'Send her away, for she keeps shouting after us.' He answered, 'I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel.' But she came and knelt before him, saying, 'Lord, help me.' He answered,

'It is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs.' She said, 'Yes, Lord, yet even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their masters' table.' Then Jesus answered her, 'Woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish.' And her daughter was healed instantly.

ONLINE ORGAN RECITAL BY JASON TANG

Despite of the current pandemic, we have been able to provide a place for learning and for experiencing our Anglican choral tradition in the past few months for young musicians. Since the reopening of churches on 1st June 2020, we have a young organist who have been with us at our choir rehearsals and choral services.

Jason Tang has just graduated from Ying Wa College after sitting the HKDSE examinations. Jason began his piano lessons as a child with Sung Man-ling and received his ATCL diploma in piano performance with distinction in 2015. In the same year he started learning the organ, first with Carmen Wong and later with Dr Helon Kwan. Jason was Chief Organist of Ying Wa College between 2016 and 2018 and he received an ATCL diploma in organ in 2019.

Jason was one of the six participants admitted to the 52nd International Organ Festival Haarlem Young Talent Programme in 2018. In this high-level programme he had the privilege to study with world-acclaimed organ professors including Leo van Doeselaar, Lorenzo Ghelmi, Jean-Baptiste Robin, Ben van Oosten and Louis Robilliard.

Jason will be pursuing his Bachelor of Music (Honours) degree at the Royal Academy of Music in London majoring in organ performance, under the tutelage of Professor David Titterington in September this year with full scholarship.

To bid him a fond farewell and to wish him a great success in his future endeavour, we proudly present him at our online organ recital. Jason will perform a programme of Bach, Couperin, Dupré, Franck and Rheinberger.
