you. And may the Lord make you increase and abound in love for one another and for all, just as we abound in love for you. And may he so strengthen your hearts in holiness that you may be blameless before our God and Father at the coming of our Lord Jesus with all his saints.

GOSPEL READING Luke 21.25-36

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.All Glory to you, O Lord.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on the earth distress among nations confused by the roaring of the sea and the waves.People will faint from fear and foreboding of what is coming upon the world, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see "the Son of Man coming in a cloud" with power and great glory. Now when these things begin to take place, stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near.'

Then he told them a parable: 'Look at the fig tree and all the trees; as soon as they sprout leaves you can see for yourselves and know that summer is already near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that the kingdom of God is near. Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

'Be on guard so that your hearts are not weighed down with dissipation and drunkenness and the worries of this life, and that day does not catch you unexpectedly, like a trap. For it will come upon all who live on the face of the whole earth. Be alert at all times, praying that you may have the strength to escape all these things that will take place, and to stand before the Son of Man.'

CHP'S ADVICE ON MEASLES

The Centre for Health Protection (CHP) of the Department of Health is investigating a confirmed case of measles. The affected person is reported to have attended a service at St John's Cathedral from 2.00pm to 3.00pm on 18th November 2018.

CHP advises attendees of the service should observe symptoms of measles from 18th November to 9th December 2018. Affected persons may present initially with fever, cough, runny nose, and red eyes. It is followed three to seven days later by a skin rash which usually spread from face to the rest of the body. Affected persons should immediately wear a face mask, refrain from school or work, avoid crowded places, seek medical advice as soon as possible, and inform the doctor of the exposure history to a measles case.

MIDNIGHT MASS TICKETS

Each Christmas Eve we welcome over 1300 people to our Midnight Mass and the numbers are growing. This year, we will be issuing tickets again to ensure the health and safety of all the attendees, and that there is a fair distribution to members of the Cathedral congregations and the wider community.

i) **Reservation of tickets** can be made by calling the Cathedral office at 2523 4157, commencing 3rd December (Mon) during office hours. (Bookings before this will not be accepted.)

- the first 200 tickets are reserved for those who have a Stewardship number or members on Electoral Roll.

- the second batch of 140 tickets will be available on a first-come-first-serve basis

- Maximum 2 tickets per person or 4 tickets per family.

ii) Those who have reserved their tickets by phone **MUST collect their tickets within 8 days after confirmation**. These tickets can be picked up during office hours on weekdays; or from 9.00am to 1.30pm on Sundays.

The remaining 100 tickets will be distributed at the main door on 24th December at 9.00pm.

iii) On the night of 24th December, ticket holders will be admitted from 10.00pm, using the South and North Transept doors of the Church.

iv) All ticket holders are requested to be seated by 10.30pm when the Devotions before Midnight Mass begins.

v) Any unoccupied seats will be released to non-ticket holders under the supervision of the sidesmen at 10.45pm.

vi) Overflow provision will be prepared for worshippers in both the Li Hall and the North lawn.
