FIRST READING (8am & 6pm)
James 2.1-17

A reading from the letter of James.

My brothers and sisters, do you with your acts of favouritism really believe in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ? For if a person with gold rings and in fine clothes comes into your assembly, and if a poor person in dirty clothes also comes in, and if you take notice of the one wearing the fine clothes and say, 'Have a seat here, please', while to the one who is poor you say, 'Stand there', or, 'Sit at my feet', have you not made distinctions among yourselves, and become judges with evil thoughts? Listen, my beloved brothers and sisters. Has not God chosen the poor in the world to be rich in faith and to be heirs of the kingdom that he has promised to those who love him? But you have dishonoured the poor. Is it not the rich who oppress you? Is it not they who drag you into court? Is it not they who blaspheme the excellent name that was invoked over you?

You do well if you really fulfil the royal law according to the scripture, 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself.' But if you show partiality, you commit sin and are convicted by the law as transgressors. For whoever keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become accountable for all of it. For the one who said, 'You shall not commit adultery', also said, 'You shall not murder.' Now if you do not commit adultery but if you murder, you have

become a transgressor of the law. So speak and so act as those who are to be judged by the law of liberty. For judgement will be without mercy to anyone who has shown no mercy; mercy triumphs over judgement.

What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but do not have works? Can faith save you? If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food, and one of you says to them, 'Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill', and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that? So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead.

This is the word of the Lord.

GOSPEL READING (8am & 6pm)
Mark 7.24-end

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark.

All Glory to you, O Lord.

Jesus set out and went away to the region of Tyre. He entered a house and did not want anyone to know he was there. Yet he could not escape notice, but a woman whose little daughter had an unclean spirit immediately heard about him, and she came and bowed down at his feet. Now the woman was a Gentile, of Syrophenician origin. She begged him to cast the demon out of her daughter. He said to her, 'Let the children be fed first, for it is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs.' But she answered him, 'Sir, even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs.' Then he said to her, 'For saying that, you may go—the demon has left your daughter.' So she went home, found the child lying on the bed, and the demon gone.

Then he returned from the region of Tyre, and went by way of Sidon towards the Sea of Galilee, in the region of the Decapolis. They brought to him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they begged him to lay his hand on him. He took him aside in

private, away from the crowd, and put his fingers into his ears, and he spat and touched his tongue. Then looking up to heaven, he sighed and said to him, ‘Ephphatha’, that is, ‘Be opened.’ And immediately his ears were opened, his tongue was released, and he spoke plainly. Then Jesus ordered them to tell no one; but the more he ordered them, the more zealously they proclaimed it. They were astounded beyond measure, saying, ‘He has done everything well; he even makes the deaf to hear and the mute to speak.’

This is the Gospel of the Lord.
All Praise to you, O Christ.

The Food Collection Box:
You can donate food directly to the hungry in our city.

The Food Collection Box is part of a scheme run by *St James' Settlement* which encourages the members of the Cathedral congregations to make food donations to stock up their food banks located around Hong Kong.

The sturdy box will take dry goods like rice, noodles and canned foods. The food needs to be well within its *sell-by date* with packaging intact. Guidelines for donors can be found on the box.

This is an opportunity to give direct and regular assistance to those who struggle to put a meal on the table. The neglected elderly, the afflicted who cannot work and the working poor — including whole families — rely on the food banks for proper nutrition. These people are the suffering side of the wealth gap.

You could buy an extra item or two in your shopping and drop it in the *Food Drop Box* when you come to church on Sunday or any day of the week if you are passing by the Cathedral. The box is available in the Porch from 7.30am to 6.00pm daily.

The Very Revd Chris Chataway, Dean of Ballarat, has been ordained and in active ministry for 33 years. He was born and educated in Adelaide, South Australia where he attended the University of Adelaide to study music. Before completing his studies he left to study theology as an ordination candidate for the Diocese of Adelaide, where he was ordained in 1985. Over the next 28 years, he served as a parish priest in 4 parishes, and was made an Archdeacon in 2005 while Rector of the Parish of Walkerville. In 2014, he left South Australia and moved to the Victorian goldfields in Ballarat, Victoria to become both Dean of Ballarat and Archdeacon of Ballarat. He has a keen interest in liturgical music and composes music and hymns for liturgical use. He has a passion for liturgy, completing a Master of Theology in 2013 through Charles Sturt University specialising in Liturgical Theology, and has been a member of the General Synod Liturgical Commission for 13 years. Chris is married to Heather, a music teacher, and they have four children aged 28, 23, and twins, 17 years old.
