FIRST READING Genesis 14.18-20

A reading from the book of Genesis.

King Melchizedek of Salem brought out bread and wine; he was priest of God Most High. He blessed him and said, 'Blessed be Abram by God Most High, maker of heaven and earth; and blessed be God Most High, who has delivered your enemies into your hand!' And Abram gave him one-tenth of everything.

This is the word of the Lord.AllThanks be to God.

SECOND READING 1 Corinthians 11.23-26

A reading from the first letter of Paul to the Corinthians.

For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, 'This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me.' In the same way he took the cup also, after supper, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.' For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

This is the word of the Lord. All Thanks be to God.

GOSPEL READING John 6.51-58

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.All Glory to you, O Lord.

Jesus said to the Jews: 'I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh.'

The Jews then disputed among themselves, saying, 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' So Jesus said to them, 'Very truly, I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day; for my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in them. Just as the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so whoever eats me will live because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven, not like that which your ancestors ate, and they died. But the one who eats this bread will live for ever.

All This is the Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, O Christ.



PARISH DEVELOPMENT GRANT OF THE DIOCESE OF HONG KONG ISLAND, HKSKH

As an initiative introduced by Bishop Matthias Der, the Diocese of Hong Kong Island would set up a Parish Development Grant for funding the new project of ministry to be carried out by parishes and mission churches. The Grant would support the churches to be engaged in the following mission priorities of the Diocese:

- Enabling people to discern and respond to God's calling in faith
- Walking with people in love and caring for people in need
- Inspiring hope and instilling peace

The maximum amount of grant available for each application is HK\$200,000 for a project period of not more than 18 months. The deadline of application will be 30th June 2022.

COMPASS ROSE HK - SRI LANKA FUND RAISING CAMPAIGN

As the COVID-19 pandemic continues to rage around the world; news reports may not have widely covered the deepening crisis in places like Sri Lanka, where the impact of the pandemic is worsening. Brother Michael of the Society of St Francis, who have a friary in the area, reports that the situation in Sri Lanka is deteriorating fast: hospitals are operating beyond capacity, and the government has made temporary hospitals out of schools and public community halls. Only two to three per cent of the people have received their first dose of vaccination.

In response to this urgent appeal, Archbishop Andrew has immediately allocated funds from the *HKSKH Archbishop's World Relief Fund* in support of the brothers' relief work. The Compass Rose Society is now turning to our church members, here in Hong Kong, to respond to this urgent appeal and give generously.

To donate, please make all cheques payable to '*St John's Cathedral*', and indicate clearly on the back of the cheque, '*Sri Lanka Fund Raising Campaign*.' Donations should be sent to the Cathedral Office to be forwarded to the Province. They will collect and send all donations to the *Franciscan Trust Fund*.

And, most importantly, please remember the people of Sri Lanka in your prayers at this difficult time.
