FIRST READING Ephesians 1.3-14

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Ephesians.

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, just as he chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before him in love. He destined us for adoption as his children through Jesus Christ, according to the good pleasure of his will, to the praise of his glorious grace that he freely bestowed on us in the Beloved. In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace that he lavished on us. With all wisdom and insight he has made known to us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure that he set forth in Christ, as a plan for the fullness of time, to gather up all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth. In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance towards redemption as

God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

This is the word of the Lord. **All Thanks be to God.**

GOSPEL READING Mark 6.14-29

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark. **All Glory to you, O Lord.**

King Herod heard of it, for Jesus' name had become known. Some were saying, 'John the baptizer has been raised from the dead; and for this reason these powers are at work in him.' But others said, 'It is Elijah.' And others said, 'It is a prophet, like one of the prophets of old.' But when Herod heard of it, he said, 'John, whom I beheaded, has been raised.'

For Herod himself had sent men who arrested John, bound him, and put him in prison on account of Herodias, his brother Philip's wife, because Herod had married her. For John had been telling Herod, 'It is not lawful for you to have your brother's wife.' And Herodias had a grudge against him, and wanted to kill him. But she could not, for Herod feared John, knowing that he was a righteous and holy man, and he protected him. When he heard him, he was greatly perplexed; and yet he liked to listen to him. But an opportunity came when Herod on his birthday gave a banquet for his courtiers and officers and for the leaders of Galilee. When his daughter Herodias came in and danced, she pleased Herod and his guests; and the king said to the girl, 'Ask me for whatever you wish, and I will give it.' And he solemnly swore to her, 'Whatever you ask me, I will give you, even half of my kingdom.' She went out and said to her mother, 'What should I ask for?' She replied, 'The head of John the baptizer.' Immediately she rushed back to the king and requested, 'I want you to give me at once the head of John the Baptist on a platter.' The king was deeply grieved; yet out of regard for his

oaths and for the guests, he did not want to refuse her. Immediately the king sent a soldier of the guard with orders to bring John's head. He went and beheaded him in the prison, brought his head on a platter, and gave it to the girl. Then the girl gave it to her mother. When his disciples heard about it, they came and took his body, and laid it in a tomb.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **All Praise to you, O Christ.**

UPDATED HEALTH MEASURES FOR PUBLIC WORSHIP AT ST JOHN'S CATHEDRAL

Following the government's recent relaxation of the restrictions on public worship, the House of Bishops has announced the relaxation of capacity limits for public worship.

From 24th June 2021 only 50% of the seating capacity is available. (The Li Hall will continue to be open as an overflow area.)

Please follow the simple guidelines below:

- Enter the Cathedral by the West Door, and exit via the side doors.
- Fill out and return the Access Record Form to us.
- Wear a mask throughout the service.
- Check your body temperature before entering.
- Cleanse your hands with hand sanitiser as you enter.

Social distancing should be maintained. Except for those in the same household - parishioners should be seated at least one metre apart from each other.

Holy Communion will be received in one kind only—the Body of Christ. Parishioners are to receive the sacrament directly into the hand and standing.

The Peace is to be exchanged by a simple bow or by a fist-and-palm salute.


The Collection will be received at the doors to support the work of the Church.

Henri Nouwen DISCERNMENT



This is essentially a collection of Henri's thoughts and writings about spiritual discernment over the years put together by two of his students.

He talks about how we find discernment through episodes of our lives and particularly as we see these through the people we meet, nature, books, and events we go through.

One of the most challenging aspects of the Christian journey is reading the signs of the times — especially those in which God intervenes and reveals new beginnings.

He says 'Our God is a God who cares, heals, guides, directs, challenges, confronts and corrects. To discern means first of all to listen to God, to pay attention to God's active presence, and to obey God's prompting, direction, leadings, and guidance.'
