#### FIRST READING Zephaniah 3.14-end

A reading from the book of the prophet Zephaniah.

Sing aloud, O daughter Zion; shout, O Israel! Rejoice and exult with all your heart, O daughter Jerusalem! The Lord has taken away the judgements against you, he has turned away your enemies. The king of Israel, the Lord, is in your midst; you shall fear disaster no more. On that day it shall be said to Jerusalem: Do not fear, O Zion; do not let your hands grow weak. The Lord, your God, is in your midst, a warrior who gives victory; he will rejoice over you with gladness, he will renew you in his love; he will exult over you with loud singing as on a day of festival. I will remove disaster from you, so that you will not bear reproach for it. I will deal with all your oppressors at that time. And I will save the lame and gather the outcast, and I will change their shame into praise and renown in all the earth. At that time I will bring you home, at the time when I gather you; for I will make you renowned and praised among all the peoples of the earth, when I restore your fortunes before your eyes, says the Lord.

This is the word of the Lord. All Thanks be to God.

#### SECOND READING Philippians 4.4-7

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Philippians.

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

This is the word of the Lord.

#### GOSPEL READING Luke 3.7-18

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

All Glory to you, O Lord.

John said to the crowds that came out to be baptized by him, 'You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruits worthy of repentance. Do not begin to say to yourselves, "We have Abraham as our ancestor"; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. Even now the axe is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.' And the crowds asked him, 'What then should we do?' In reply he said to them, 'Whoever has two coats must share with anyone who has none; and whoever has food must do likewise.' Even tax-collectors came to be baptized, and they asked him, 'Teacher, what should we do?' He said to them, 'Collect no more than the amount prescribed for you.' Soldiers also asked him, 'And we, what should we do?' He said to them, 'Do not extort money from anyone by threats or false accusation, and be satisfied with your wages.' As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them

by saying, 'I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.' So, with many other exhortations, he proclaimed the good news to the people.

Thanks be to God! This year, we will come together to celebrate the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ at St John's Cathedral for our Midnight Mass of the Nativity on Christmas Eve again. However, due to the social distancing requirements, only 50% of the Cathedral's seating capacity can be filled at our services.

As usual, admission to the Midnight Mass is by ticket only. However, no walk-in tickets would be available this year. <u>Please note that all tickets for the Mid-night Mass have already been reserved for distribution</u>.

#### Ticket holders are reminded of the following:

- 1. On the night of 24<sup>th</sup> December, ticket holders will be admitted from 10.15pm from the West Door of the Cathedral; entrance of Li Hall and the entry point of Garden seating area.
- 2. All ticket holders are requested to be seated by 10.30pm when the Devotion before Midnight Mass begins.
- 3. At 10.45pm any unoccupied seats will be released to non-ticket holders at the discretion of the sidesmen.
- 4. Body temperature will be taken, and hands will be sanitised before entering the seating areas.
- 5. Please complete and return the Access Record Form.
- 6. Please wear a mask throughout the service.
