NOTICE OF REVISION OF THE ELECTORAL ROLL

For over 170 years, St John's Cathedral has been offering the love and hope of Jesus Christ to the people of Hong Kong. Through your prayers, support, attendance and ministry, you are upholding this fine Christian tradition and are making our community a blessing for many. To be part of the Electoral Roll is another way you demonstrate your sense of belonging which allows you to participate actively in the affairs of our common life and ministry.

St John's Cathedral is once again revising its Electoral Roll. All qualified electors who wish their names to appear in the Electoral Roll must complete an 'Electoral Roll Declaration,' which is attached/available at the Cathedral Office. You are a qualified elector if you are (a) 18 years old and above; and (b) are baptized and a member of the Anglican Church or a Church in communion therewith; (c) do not belong to any religious body which is not in communion with the Anglican Church; and (d) are not entered upon the Electoral Roll of any other Church in the Diocese. If you wish to cast a vote at the forthcoming ACM, to be held on Sunday 25th April 2021, and are not yet on the Electoral Roll, you must complete and submit an Electoral Roll Declaration Form.

Completed forms must reach the Cathedral Office, by 7th April 2021 for inclusion in the Electoral Roll for the purpose of the Annual Church Meeting 2021. If you are unsure about your status on the Electoral Roll, please contact the Cathedral Office at 2523 4157.
